This report outlines the completion of our **yearly (2025) project work undertaken and implemented for Saalik Youth Project [SYP] with the fundraising efforts of £35,186.50**. # Project 1 Iftar Meals

10

## Yemen, Nepal, Pakistan, Uganda & Palestine



While many of us break our fasts with abundance, millions around the world face Ramadan amid hardship. For families affected by poverty and conflict, iftar is often marked by uncertainty rather than nourishment, making the observance of this **sacred month** especially difficult.



Communities in Uganda and Nepal continue to struggle with **food insecurity and rising living costs**. Yemen remains trapped in a prolonged humanitarian crisis, with millions dependent on aid. In Sri Lanka, **economic instability** has pushed low-income families deeper into hardship, while in Pakistan, climate-related disasters have left many unable to meet basic needs. In Palestine, **ongoing restrictions** and conflict severely limit access to food, livelihoods, and essential services.



In the midst of these challenges, your generosity made a real difference. By providing iftar meals, you helped ease hunger, restore dignity, and uphold the true spirit of Ramadan—compassion and generosity. During Ramadan 2025, **a total of 10,108 iftar meals** were distributed, bringing comfort and hope to those most in need.

# Project 2 Project Pani

## Sri Lanka



Water pumps play a vital role in **Sri Lanka**, particularly in rural and drought-prone regions where communities face ongoing challenges in accessing safe and reliable water. **Seasonal dry spells, aging water infrastructure, and dependence on distant or contaminated water sources** mean that many families struggle to meet their daily water needs.

Your installation of **117 water pumps across Sri Lanka** has brought lasting change to underserved communities. These pumps now provide consistent access to clean water, reducing dependence on unsafe sources and easing the daily burden faced by households.



Families **no longer need to travel long distances** to collect water, allowing more time for education, income-generating activities, and community wellbeing. Improved access to clean water has also strengthened hygiene and sanitation practices, leading to better health outcomes and a reduction in water-related illnesses.



In addition, the availability of water has supported **small-scale agriculture and household cultivation**, helping to improve food security and strengthen local livelihoods. Through this initiative, you have helped Sri Lankan communities build resilience, dignity, and a more sustainable future.

# Projects 3, 4 and 5 Water Handpumps

## Pakistan, Nepal and Uganda



Access to clean water remains a major challenge in Nepal, Uganda, and Pakistan, particularly in rural and underserved communities.

In Nepal, **remote and mountainous terrain limits access** to safe water, making pumps essential for reliable year-round supply.

In Uganda, **dependence on surface water and prolonged dry seasons** expose communities to waterborne diseases, with pumps significantly improving health and hygiene.

In Pakistan, **groundwater scarcity and climate pressures** make water pumps vital for both safe drinking water and agricultural irrigation.



Your installation of **27 hand pumps and 2 solar-powered wells** in these countries has transformed access to safe drinking water, reducing reliance on contaminated sources and easing the daily strain on communities.



Reliable water access has also **supported livelihoods, enabling activities such as livestock rearing and small-scale enterprises** that depend on a consistent water supply.

# Build a Masjid



## Uganda




In Uganda, mosques play an essential role in the spiritual and communal lives of Muslims, serving not only as places of worship but also as centres for education, support, and community unity.

Unfortunately, **this year's mosque appeal did not reach its intended target, raising £101.45.** While this fell short of the amount required for a new build, these funds will be meaningfully allocated towards the **upkeep and maintenance of Masjid Saalik**, the 250-capacity mosque established last year through the partnership between SYP and As-Salaam Foundation.



Masjid Saalik continues to serve a high-need area, providing a dedicated space for **daily prayers, Jumu'ah congregations, and Islamic learning.** It remains a hub for Qur'anic education, community programmes, and charitable activities, supporting both spiritual growth and social wellbeing. Importantly, the mosque has removed the burden on worshippers who **previously travelled up to 6km** to fulfil their religious obligations.



Although the appeal outcome was modest, every contribution plays a role in sustaining this vital community asset and ensuring Masjid Saalik remains a place of worship, learning, and support for years to come.

# Orphan Sponsorships

## Uganda



Uganda continues to face a severe orphan crisis, driven largely by the long-term impact of the **AIDS epidemic, widespread poverty, and the legacy of armed conflict**. With over two million orphans in a population of approximately 45 million, many children are left without consistent access to education, healthcare, and basic necessities, leaving them vulnerable to neglect, exploitation, and abuse.



We are pleased to report that the **£2,015.14 raised, largely through the sponsorship of eight orphans**, has made a meaningful and lasting impact. Thanks to your generosity, these children—previously supported in Sironko, Uganda—are now safe, healthy, and continuing to thrive.



We are proud to share that these eight children are now **cared for within our own purpose-built facility, As-Salaam Orphanage** in Kitantalo, Uganda, where they receive stable accommodation, education, healthcare, and emotional support in a nurturing environment. Your sponsorship has provided them with consistency, dignity, and hope for the future.

On behalf of the children and the entire team, we extend our heartfelt thanks for your compassion and ongoing commitment to transforming young lives.

# Project 8 Rohingya Deployment

## Bangladesh



In **November 2025**, as part of our winter relief efforts for the SYP programme, **97 winter relief packs** were personally distributed by our Trustee, **Tariq Khan**, to **Rohingya refugee families in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh**.

This distribution formed part of a wider humanitarian mission that had originally been planned for mid-November, aimed at supporting some of the most vulnerable members of the Rohingya community—families who continue to **endure unimaginable hardship after years of displacement**.



Each winter pack, **valued at £60**, contained **essential items** including warm blankets and hygiene supplies, providing critical protection against the harsh winter conditions faced in the camps. These packs were a lifeline for families living in fragile shelters, many of which remain poorly insulated and exposed to cold winds and heavy rain.



This intervention helped **protect families during one of the most dangerous periods of the year** and stands as a clear example of how targeted support can make a real and immediate difference in emergency settings.

Together, with the support of our donors, we were able to bring warmth, relief, and hope to families facing an incredibly difficult winter.


